3B. Project Description

1. Provide a description that addresses the entire scope of the proposed project.

“Giving Hope a Home II” (GGH II) is a community initiative to identify 40 chronically homeless households (CHH) and provide them with Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH). GGH II will serve 100% CHH, and will adhere to the priorities of HUD CPD-14-012. The project emphasizes housing CHH with a history of high utilization of crisis services, including but not limited to; emergency rooms, jails, and psychiatric facilities. Policies and practices such as the use of trauma informed care and victim confidentiality to address the needs of persons and households fleeing domestic violence have been developed. The project has entry and intake processes that do not screen applicants out due to factors such as employment, income, substance use, or criminal history. GGH II will only accept applicants through the NEFL CoC Intake & Assessment system, in which Ability Housing (AH) is a full participant. AH agrees to accept the highest need eligible applicants as determined by the VI-SPDAT/SPDAT score. The project adheres to Housing First principals of low barrier, prioritizes quick housing placement and stabilization in PH, and does not have service participation requirements or preconditions to entry. There are no programmatic limits as to how long the resident may remain in the program. Continued residency is not subject to any special rules or requirements of participation in any particular service(s). Participants are subject to the terms of a standard occupancy agreement. I M Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. will be the provider of support services and intensive case management to participants. Support service providers are trained in the Evidence-Based Practices (EBP), of Housing First and PSH, which also incorporate the EBPs of Harm Reduction and Motivational Interviewing, as well as SSI/SSDI Outreach Access and Recovery (SOAR). AH encourages current residents to complete training as a PSS and currently has two residents engaged in this extensive training program. AH contracts with Mental Health America to provide SOAR.


