STAR PROGRAM

Services. Treatment. Recovery

SAMHSA GBHI

- STAR is an out-patient community based program tasked with helping Northeast Florida residents who have experienced or are experiencing homelessness. Additionally, STAR is available to help those who have received housing services but are in danger of losing their housing. The STAR team utilizes Case Management, Counseling, and Peer Specialist recovery based solutions to come along side our clients and provide support. We hope to assist our clients with the individualized services they need to establish a healthy and self-directed lifestyle.



SERVICES

- The STAR program assists individuals and families through case management by networking and linking with a variety of community services to meet the diverse needs of our clients. Case management services begin with a brief assessment to determine individual needs, followed by collaborative service coordination within the STAR team and the broader community system. The goal of our case management department is to promote and support independence and self-sufficiency.

TREATMENT

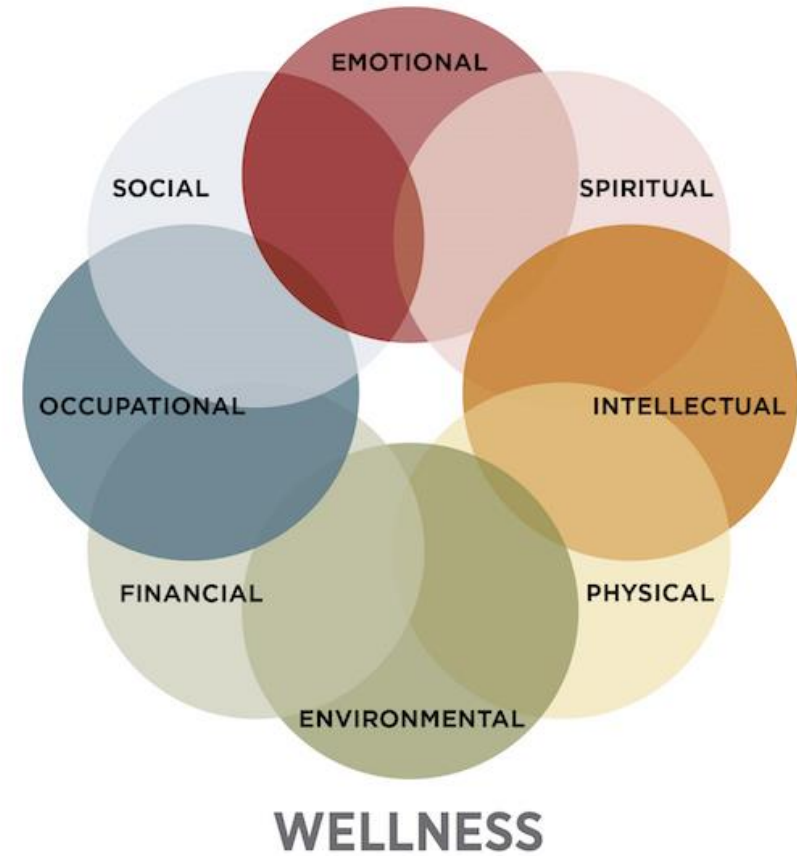
- STAR will provide screening and assessments for substance use disorder, trauma, and mental health disorders. Counseling is provided by master's level clinicians utilizing evidenced based therapy approaches such as 12 Step Facilitation, Anger Management, EMDR and Seeking Safety for trauma, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), and Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT). Individualized treatment plans are created to meet each client's needs and may include individual and/or group counseling.

RECOVERY

- The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) has defined recovery as “A process of change through which individuals improve their health and wellness, live a self-directed life, and strive to reach their full potential”.
- SAMHSA’s 4 major dimensions of recovery include **Health**, which includes treatment for alcoholism, addiction, and mental health disorders; **Home**, having a stable and safe place to live; **Purpose**, meaningful daily activities and participation in society; and **Community**, relationships and social networks that provide friendship, love, and hope.

Eight Dimensions of Wellness

STAR has a team of Certified Recovery Peer Specialists who assess each client's recovery needs using the SAMHSA 8 Dimensions of Wellness. The Peers use their own lived experience to walk alongside STAR participants to share their experience, strength, and hope.
